as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. John 20:7

In Bible days when you wanted a fine piece of furniture made, you picked someone with a reputation for excellence – a master carpenter or a finish carpenter. But these carpenters had an interesting custom. When a carpenter completed a job, he took off his apron, folded it up, and set it on his finished work, signifying the job was complete. With that picture in mind, read this:

'Early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved....Peter and the other disciple started out for the tomb. They were both running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He stooped and looked in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went inside. He also noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying apart from the other wrappings. Then the disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in, and he saw and believed – for until then they still hadn't understood the Scriptures that said Jesus must rise from the dead' (John 20:1-9).

Note the words 'the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up'. The master carpenter had finished the job. Our salvation was complete. You don't have to work to be saved, you only have to put your trust in Christ, and your sins are forgiven and your place in heaven assured.

Bethany Lutheran Church Council Meeting
Thursday, February 15, 2023, 7:00 p.m.

Members Present: Pastor Rod Krueger, Bob Koehler, Mike Baarts, Amy Stingle, Gary Holcomb, and Cheri Rietveld.

PRAYER: Pastor Rod opened with prayer.

JANUARY MINUTES: Amy made a motion to accept the January minutes, Mike seconded the motion, motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Elders: Mike Baarts reported that attendance for January had decreased 29 ½ % verses January 2023 and for the fiscal year, November through January, attendance increased 1.2%; An Elder was assigned to oversee the Automated External Defibrillator for a year, checking that it is working properly. Mike notified the local EMS that we have installed and have a working AED; The Elders put together a program called, "The Red Letter Challenge". It's a 6-week study on the words Jesus spoke while on earth. The study is for everyone in the congregation, looking for 50 people and 8 leaders. There will be multiple classes and times. The cost of the materials will be about \$1,100 and will start April 7th. There will be a sign-up sheet on the information table.

Church Properties: Bob reported from the church properties meeting, that he contacted Central Temp and the quote from last November, did not include changes to the area next to the Youth room upstairs, plans and design fees and seal roof curbs. The committee made a motion to except Central Temp's quote and other costs not to exceed \$75,000.00, with unanimous approval; As of June 1st, the city of Kaukauna will no longer pick up trash, and got a quote from GFL of \$84.00 a month to provide both recycling and trash, 2 yd. locking recycling dumpster and 2 yd. locking trash dumpster; Properties committee recommends getting a quote and information for new tables and chairs from a memorial given to Bethany for chairs; The baseboard heat is not operating in two different locations, properties will check unto it.

CALLED STAFF REPORTS:

Pastor's Report: Pastor Rod reported that he is in the middle of the sermon series on Colossians and the Lenten series, 'You meant it for evil but God meant it for good' will go through Holy Week; There was one baptism in February; We served about 50 at our Community meal in January and our February community meal will be combined with our Chili Cook-off. We will have a meal in March and April, no meal in May, a meal in June, no meal in July and August

and start back with the community meals in September; Wednesday of Holy Week there will be a Seder meal, a Maundy Thursday service, two services on Good Friday and three services on Easter Sunday and Easter Breakfast; Pastor reported that we have 15 shut-ins being visited.

Family Ministry: Jessica reported that the youth went bowling in February; We will be hosting an Easter Egg Hunt on March 23rd; VBS is planned for July 15-19th; We did a calendar of events through the summer.

NEW BUSINESS:

Voters meeting date, Air conditioning: With the cost of replacing the air conditioning, a voter's meeting will be held on March 10th at 11:00.

Memorial Gifts: Gary presented that fact that we have a lot of memorials designated for a specific gift that have been around for a while. He presented a hand-out of all the different memorial gifts. After discussion, Amy made a motion to spend the money for the air conditioning from (A) the Air Conditioning fund, (B) undesignated memorials, (C) 2023 surplus, (D) Thrivent Choice dollars, Mike seconded the motion, motion carried.

Monthly "Thank You": Our monthly 'Thank You' goes to Barb Dishno, Kristine and Shayne Whittman for the beautiful cards they made for our shut-ins. Bethany is very grateful for their kindness and generosity, sharing their God given talents with others.

March Meeting: March Council meeting will be March 14th, Thursday at 6:30.

Closing Prayer: The Council closed with the Lord's Prayer.
